Migrant Women in Europe: knowledge, skills and attitudes to act as Integration Leaders with the support of ENGAGE educational proposal

Partner's organisations from France, Austria, Cyprus, Croatia, Ireland and Italy, that worked together to provide educational stimuli and resources to migrant women to act as Integration Leaders within the Erasmus+ project "ENGAGE – Supporting Migrant Women as Integration Leaders", announce

the Final Partnership Meeting in Bastia (Corse – FR) on the 16th /17th of July 2019.

As a partnership we have taken on the challenge of devising, developing, testing in the field, and reshaping learning programmes and resources together and with the full involvement of the potential beneficiaries of Engage in all its phases. The final partners' meeting will be an opportunity to enhance the potential of migrant women in integration processes and the role of non-formal and informal education to improve the well-being of communities (foreign and indigenous). The further sharing of our intellectual outputs with all key stakeholders will help us to evaluate the quality of ENGAGE's training offer and reflect about the impacts that pilot activities in the different partner countries have generated, and which they can generate.

The common development of the Integration Leaders' Curriculum and the Open Educational Resources was sustained by the Transnational In-Service Training Event held in Marseille in November '18 for the partners' trainers involved in the local testing of the ENGAGE model. The accessibility of these educational supports, proposed in a blended way and targeted to strengthen the digital competences too, is granted through the availability of an Open e-Learning Platform in six European languages (Croatian, English, French, German, Greek and Italian).

The local pilots of this first gender specific curriculum that places women at the centre of the integration process – has highlighted the desire of many foreign women living in our countries for some years to expose themselves in social, professional and public life. In this last meeting we will further deepen these experiences and needs for the open sharing with our stakeholders, taking into account the multiple perspectives, with the scope to provide useful indications for those who hold the decision levers through the ENGAGE Policy Paper.
