Migrant Women in Europe: knowledge, skills and attitudes to empower through “ENGAGE - Supporting Migrant Women as Integration Leaders”

Partner’s organisations, involved within the development of the Erasmus+ project ENGAGE, are now committed to finalise all the expected intellectual outputs, and to share with the core stakeholders and decision makers the conclusions of this on the field experience, collected in a Policy Paper.

In all countries of ENGAGE consortium, partners have realised national campaigns to diffuse and discuss about the findings of our local pilots with migrant women, and the recommendations collected among them about their conditions and which measures could be put on the ground to improve the wellbeing of the foreign communities in the European countries.

“We are very excited to announce that ENGAGE project realised and tested innovative tools that now could be exploited all around Europe – said Tommaso Scavone, Project Manager. On our project website migrant support workers and migrant women can find 1) a bespoke integration leader curriculum addressed to migrant women and girls that supports the acquisition of key skills essential to their new role as integration leaders in their communities. It is a 65-pages document presenting learning modules and resources developed to build skills, knowledge and competences through non-formal and informal learning methods. It is available in 6 EU languages (EN, FR, DE, GR, HR, IT) and it is structured in 6 modules (Interpersonal Skills; Assertive Communication; Cultural Identity; Community Empowerment; Civic Engagement; Leadership); 2) an in-service training programme for adult education and migrant support workers working in migrant support centres that provides clear guidance and suggestions on how to address and implement training content and activities addressed to migrant women and girls. It is a 40-pages document available in 6 EU languages (EN, FR, DE, GR, HR, IT); 3) a toolbox of 85 resources to support the integration of migrant women and girls. Resources are available in 6 languages (EN, FR, DE, HR, IT, Arabic); 4) a policy paper aiming to promote policy change at local, regional, national and EU level”.
